



Pam is Global Chief Operating Officer of Activism and Shareholder Advisory at Goldman Sachs. She advises on a range of complex and contested shareholder matters, including shareholder activism, hostile mergers and acquisitions, and environmental, social and governance challenges.

Previously, Pam led the firm's activism and shareholder advisory practice for consumer retail and healthcare clients globally. Earlier in her career, she was a member of the Natural Resources Leveraged Finance desk and a member of the Global Natural Resources Group in New York

Pam also serves as co-chair of the Investment Banking Council for Advancement of Racial Equity at Goldman Sachs. She is also a member of the Steering Committee of One Million Black Women, an initiative launched by Goldman Sachs to commit 10 billion in investment capital and 100 million in philanthropic capital to impact the lives of One Million Black Women.
